Reflection: From Val

When I was a child we called Shadrach, Meshach & Abednego, shake-your-bed, make-your-bed, and into-bed-you-go! Unusual names, but what's special about these young men? They chose to be thrown into a blazing furnace rather than bow down to worship a golden image, and they believed that their God was worthy of praise whether he saved them from the fire or not.

What happened when they were thrown in the fire? Firstly, the ropes that had held them firmly tied were burned off, so that they were free to walk around, maybe even run and dance! Then, they realized that they were unharmed - not even a bit singed, as they examined their skin and clothes in awe and wonder. Finally, they were enjoying the company of an angelic presence, or was it even the Lord God Almighty communing with them?

It's in the fiery trials of life that our faith is stripped back to basics. Do I believe that my God is able? Will I hold on and trust even if things don't go how I want them to? It's in the fire that we can find freedom from things that have tied us up in knots, letting the superficial fall away and connecting with the One who is always present.

- Many Christians have been martyred for their faith. What difference would it make to this faith story if these men had died?
- On a scale of 1-10 how free do you feel right now? Physical, mental, spiritual? How can we be 'free in spirit' in the middle of restrictions or trials?

Jesus is present with you in the midst of whatever situation you are in today. Ask that your awareness of this truth would be increased. *"You came near when I called you, and you said, 'Do not fear'."* Lamentations 3 v.57
