## Reflection: From Val

Have you ever been let into a secret about the future, or known about something before it happened? Joshua did! The Lord said to Joshua, "See, I have delivered Jericho into your hands." (Josh 6 v2) God was going to give Joshua a miraculous victory in an impossible situation and announces it as 'a done deal' a week before it happens. When the Lord says "See", there was actually nothing to see, except a locked up Jericho, secured by two very thick, very tall walls, and so God is inviting Joshua to see with spiritual eyes something that was not yet an actuality.

What a wonderful thing it is that our Lord shares knowledge, wisdom and insight with us. Of course there are often times that God says, "You don't need to know what is going to happen, you just need to follow me a step at a time", but how spine-tingling it is when the Lord reveals something of his vision and plans. What, then, is required of us? Faith, like Joshua, to believe that God will do as he has promised, and willingness to action the steps he gives us to take.

Living in a pandemic has a sense of battle about it. When will it end? How will we get through it? This could be a time for God's people to seek the Lord's wisdom, and invite God to speak into our situation, for fresh perspective and a plan for days to come.

2. Ask the Lord to give you a specific 'word' for right now, as well as an insight for future days.
